Lorain County Results

- > One has occupancy standards or limits
- > One has a definition of family
- > One defines "dwelling unit" or "residential unit"
- > One has a definition of "disability"
- > A couple see potential barriers for development of affordable housing
- > One lacks fair housing ordinance, policy, regulation, or code chapter, almost half of respondents don't know
- > Most seem to have some AFFH practices
